


# Closing the Gaps



Two trail projects are currently in development. When completed in 2018, the Triangle will be **97% off-road**.


# Cary: White Oak Greenway

- Links Cary's Greenway network with the American Tobacco Trail (ATT).
- Easement acquisition for the 2-mile trail section from the ATT to the Green Level Church Rd will continue through the end of 2016.
- 0.4-mile corridor between MacArthur Drive and Davis Drive is currently in design.
- 0.4-mile corridor between MacArthur Drive and Davis Drive is currently in design.
- Construction completion for both projects is anticipated by winter of 2018.




# Raleigh: Gorman St Cycle Track

- Construction will begin Summer or Fall 2017






